


### Q1 What would you chose as the future of the Park?



Answered: 126 Skipped: 0



**Q3 Are you aware of the planning currently underway to create a tourist destination including several structures and buildings on the Puhoi Pioneers Memorial Park?**







I as a Puhoi Community Forum member and local resident was part of the decision making process, via community consultation and submissions, who helped create the present Puhoi Pioneers Memorial Park management plan, presently under review. Although not specifically stated in the current plan, I was one of a number of residents who stated we did not wish to see further structures built on what, apart from the already-existing Sports Club, was undeveloped farmland and bush. In view of Puhoi's rapidly increasing tourist and residential visitor and population growth (and plans for this to further increase) I would prefer this land to remain as undeveloped, open recreational land. I would be happy to see the 'footprint' created by the present storage shed ( formerly used for storage for horse events and other equipment by the old Waitemata Agricultural and Pastoral Show, now gone from Puhoi) at the eastern ends of the grounds, and almost out of sight, used for a community building for the Scouts and Puhoi Playgroup, and possibly, if practical, for storage of gear to be used in a Civil Defence emergency. Such a local Emergency Response Group for Puhoi is now in formation. Moving the playgroup to this site could free up the old Puhoi Convent School for entire use by the Puhoi Historical Society, which needs a larger home, but which, I feel, would be more appropriately housed in the historic school building. I do not support commercial and tourist ventures on the Puhoi Pioneers Memorial Park. Increasingly I am hearing residents voice the opinion that Puhoi is already attracting too many tourists for the comfort and convenience of its own people. There is a "news letter" put out by Judith Williams (many people do not read), which did include the meeting information, however it was in a tiny font (10 or smaller) at the bottom of the page with no heading. It would seem something as important as this should have been advertised widely and loudly. I have used this park since the 1980's as a child, and have continued to enjoy it, being part of planting restoration days, and community and personal use. It is a quiet relaxing space, free from human traffic and "city" life. For something like this to be pushed forward, and underhanded is disrespectful to those who have put in blood sweat and tears to preserve enjoy and love this place. This project is not for the people of puhoi, Puhoi IS a little village. Puhoi needs to be protected from further commercial enterprises and buildings. I am part of Puhoi, it is part of me and by partners bohemian identity and proud history. That history is in the walls of the Hall, Church and Pub. We enjoy the quiet life, which we have managed to keep private (you will find most of the descendants do not want to be in the lime light, and keep to themselves). This is no reason to disregard the feelings of the locals both new and old, and not let them have a voice.
